Early Years Setting



We promote British Values through our EYFS Curriculum, the 9 Habits, Jigsaw and significant celebrations including festivals.

Democracy

Within our setting we support children's personal, social and emotional development (PSED) by giving them opportunities to develop their self-confidence and self-awareness, to make choices and decision about what they want to explore and how they're going to use resources. This will be evidenced through taking turns, sharing, negotiating, collaborating and **making decisions** together. Skills that are essential if we are to get on in the adult world.

Rule of law

Within our setting we learn to manage our own feelings and behaviour: about learning right from wrong: about behaving within agreed and clearly defined boundaries: about dealing with the consequences.

Individual liberty

The remaining two values are both embedded within PSED *and* Understanding the World. For **individual liberty** we focus on children's self-confidence and self-awareness and people and communities. We help children to develop a positive sense of themselves. We help them to develop their self-knowledge, self-esteem and increase their confidence in their own abilities.

Every time we share our Power of Reading Text we are giving children the time and space to explore the language of feelings and responsibility; reflect on their differences and understand that we are all free to have different opinions.

Mutual respect and tolerance

Finally, **mutual respect and tolerance**: where we learn to treat others as we want to be treated. How to be part of a community, manage our feelings and behaviour; and form relationships with others.
